

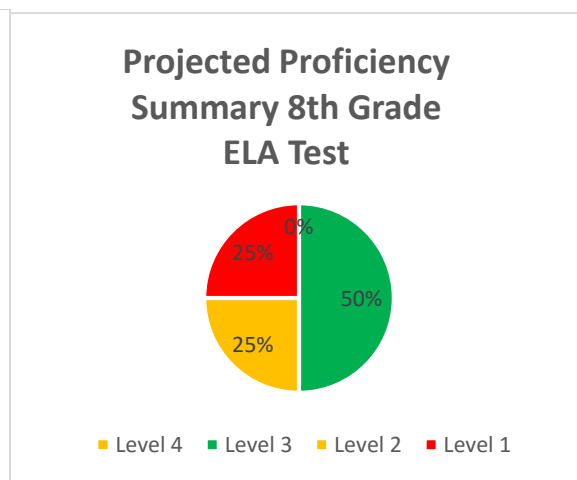
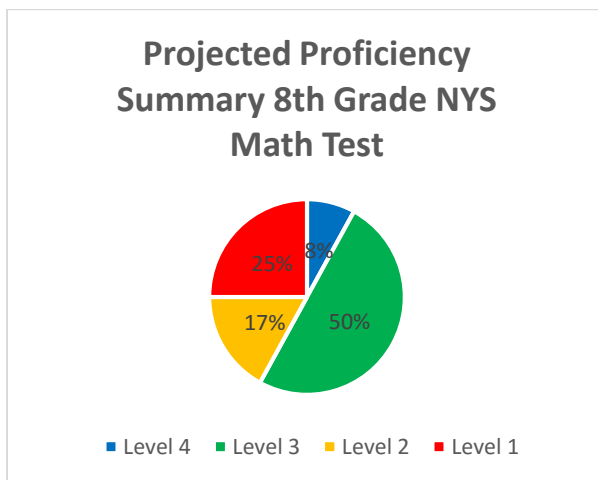

In lieu of state testing Southern Tier Catholic School (STCS) conducts NWEA assessments. The **NWEA** assessments are: Measures of Academic Progress® (**MAP**®) – These diagnostic computerized **tests** are adaptive and offered in Reading, Language Usage, and Mathematics. When taking a **MAP**® **test**, the difficulty of each question is based on how well a student answers the previous questions.

While results from end-of-year summative assessments arrive in the summer, NWEA computer adaptive tests provide immediate results in the fall, winter, and spring. This lets teachers use the information from MAP throughout the school year to help create a unique learning plan for the child. Growth, projected growth, and Lexile level are just a few components that can be tracked throughout the year.

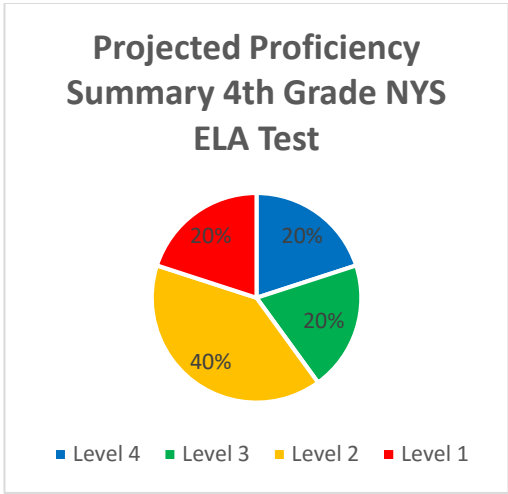
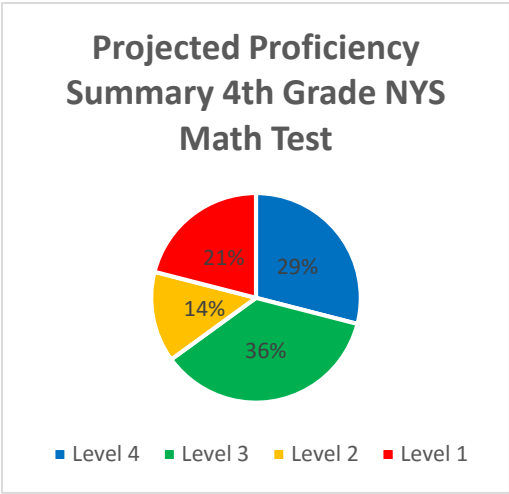
